heritage. Additionally, ICC regularly hosts various social and cultural events in Qatar, providing a platform for community members to interact and fostering a sense of patriotism among compatriots.

Our facilities include a library-cum-reading room and a variety of executive Indoor halls such as the Delhi, Benguluru & Mumbai Lounges which can host a variety of social activities that can accommodate up to sixty persons. ICC also has a community hall named Ashoka which is equipped with all the required utilities that can accommodate a gathering of three hundred.

A significant milestone for ICC was the establishment of the Indian embassy's consular services in Qatar on September 19, 2004. The consular desk at ICC hassince garnered an over whelming response from the community, offering services such as applications for new passports, passport renewals, and Police Clearance Certificates (PCC)


